Attitude

Your attitude toward the SLI program, its core principals, and the overall mission is very important. This program is designed to challenge you to go to the next level in your leadership development and is naturally geared toward students who want to be stretched and challenged. It is not geared for students who simply want to enhance their college transcript or are participating because their parent or friend wants them to. **You need to have the desire.** Once you sign up, we assume that you truly want to be in the program.

Actions

Your behavior in the classroom, on the playing field, and on the weekends is very important. I Timothy 4:12 is our cornerstone scripture that sets parameters for your SLI participation. You speech, conduct, love, faith, and purity are all components to becoming a positive influencer and leader. Any pattern of dishonoring these could jeopardize your involvement with SLI. Ultimately, and even more importantly, you jeopardize your testimony as a Christian when you make compromises in these areas.

Attendance

It is our desire to use SLI to cultivate Kingdom Leaders. Part of this process for each student is to develop and mature into a responsible and committed citizen, person, and participant. There are many ways this is accomplished, but one particular example is simply being present at the scheduled program meetings. Your attendance is not only beneficial for your spiritual and leadership development, it is important from the perspective that you honor the commitment you have made.

There is a point at which the integrity of the program is compromised due to absences. In other words, not only is the participant missing valuable training, but he/she is also demonstrating to others that the program is not a high priority. Students will be in jeopardy of losing the privilege of participating in SLI if they do not attend the scheduled sessions. Attendance at SLI-sponsored sessions is a minimum-level commitment and responsibility. It is a requirement that must be honored.
